- GM retained No. 1 total sales position in the U.S.

- The Cadillac Escalade and Escalade ESV earned more than 18% of the retail market.

Safe Act Recognition Board

Here are some examples from the 2 last weeks of how the Defiance team practices safety...

Extensive work was completed over the long Easter weekend with no safety incidents. Lockouts were also verified on the RTO jobs to ensure safety of workers.

A maintenance group leader held a go and see after a near miss in PSand. The group leader received good feedback from the team and was well organized.

Pre-machine team on 3rd shift had a leak that needed to be investigated. Instead of using an SOP to have an employee go in with power on, they used a Go-Pro to investigate, eliminating probability of injury.

On 2nd shift in PSand cast/melt, there was a job involving replacing heating elements that had risk. Electricians and Group leader did a pre-task plan, identifying hazards and eliminating them.

In developmental, trades were cutting and grinding with all appropriate PPE, keeping themselves safe.

An SO2 alarm occurred over the weekend. People in the area followed procedure. In particular, one electrician, who is familiar with the area, assured that everyone followed the correct steps.
