On this day in history (June 6)....

1816 10" of snowfall in New England, part of a "year without a summer" which followed the eruption of Mount Tambora in Indonesia The eruption of Mount Tambora was the largest eruption ever witnessed. Its Volcanic Explosivity Index (VEI) was 7, the only known eruption on that scale since the eruption of Lake Taupo in about 180 AD. The eruption blew 150 cubic km into the atmosphere, killing 10,000 people initially. The eruptions' column was so high it reached the stratosphere at an altitude of more than 43 kilometers. The effects were felt worldwide, 1816 was "the year without a summer". Crops failed across Asia and up to 90,000 people probably died of famine. It was the second-coldest year in the Northern Hemisphere since 1400 and parts of North America experienced frost and snow in June and July.

1822 Alexis St. Martin shot in the stomach and treated by physician William Beaumont on Mackinac Island. Leads Beaumont to conduct digestion experiments through hole in St. Martin's stomach. 1844 Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA) formed by George Williams in London

1882 Electric iron patented by New York inventor Henry W. Seely. It weighed almost 15 pounds and was very slow to heat up.

1889 Great Fire in Seattle destroys 25 downtown blocks

1890 United States Polo Association forms, NYC 1892 Chicago South Side Elevated Railroad opens (1st 3.6 miles)

1900 US Congress pass an act authorizing a civil code and government for the territory of Alaska after gold discoveries bring lawlessness and disorder to the area

1916 Voters in East Cleveland, Ohio approve women suffrage

1925 Walter Chrysler founds automobile manufacturer Chrysler Corporation

1932 The Revenue Act of 1932 is enacted, creating the first gas tax in the United States, at a rate of 1 cent per US gallon $(1/4 \, g/L)$ sold

1933 Richard Hollingshead opens the world's 1st Drive-In movie theater on Admiral Wilson Boulevard in Pennsauken, New Jersey

1933 US Employment Service created

1936 Aviation gasoline 1st produced commercially Paulsboro, New Jersey

1941 1st US Navy vessel constructed as mine layer, USS Terror (CM-5) launched from the Philadelphia Navy Yard

1941 MLB New York Giants use plastic batting helmets for 1st time

1942 1st nylon parachute jump is made by Ameican parachute tester Adeline Gray (27-ish), at Brainard Field, an airport near Hartford, Connecticut; Dupont teamed with the Pioneer Parachute Company to develop use of an alternative to silk 1944 Alaska Airlines commences operations

1944 World War II: All Major League Baseball games are cancelled in honor of the D-Day landings in northern France

1965 The Rolling Stones release music single "(I Can't Get No) Satisfaction"

1968 Senator Robert F. Kennedy dies from his wounds after he was shot the previous night

1969 Joe Namath resigns from NFL after Pete Rozelle, football commissioner, said he must sell his stake in a bar

1978 US TV news program "20/20", created by Roone Arledge premieres on ABC

1991 Dana Plato receives 6 yr suspended sentence for robbing a video store

1991 NBC announces Jay Leno will succeed Johnny Carson as host on "The Tonight Show" on May 25, 1992

Facts about bias and discrimination

Bias and discrimination affects the lives of people from various sexual orientations in different ways. For instance, data from the Center for American Progress suggest that:

More than 1 in 3 LGBTQ+ Americans faced discrimination of some kind in the past year, including more than 3 in 5 transgender Americans.

More than half of LGBTQ+ Americans report that they hide a relationship due to discrimination. About one-fifth to one-third have made changes to aspects of their personal or work lives.

Discrimination is most common among people of color, transgender people, and disabled people.

The FBI reports that hate crimes based on sexual orientation make up 16.7% of crimes. Read about the ongoing hate crime epidemic and how bias plays a role.

One third of LGBTQ+ Americans reported discrimination that affected their ability to get jobs.

1 in 2 LGBTQ Americans report how discrimination has a negative impact on their mental and well-being. And 29% said it had a major impact on their financial well-being.
