On this day in history (November 6, 2025)....

1572 Supernova is observed in constellation known as Cassiopeia
1813 Congress of Chilpancingo declares Mexico independent from Spain
1844 Spain grants Dominican Republic independence
1850 1st Hawaiian fire engine
1860 Republican Abraham Lincoln of Illinois is elected the 16th President of the United States of America
1861 Jefferson Davis elected to 6 year term as US Confederate President
1862 New York-San Francisco direct telegraphic link forms
1869 In the first US college football game, players use their hands, feet, heads, or sides to advance the ball, but they cannot run with it; Rutgers College beats New Jersey (now Princeton) 6-4
1879 Canada celebrates its first Thanksgiving Day
1885 US mint at Carson City, Nevada, directed to close
1888 Benjamin Harrison (R-Sen-Ind) is elected US President, defeating sitting President Grover Cleveland (D), 233 electoral votes to 168, Cleveland receives slightly more votes
1900 Republican US President William McKinley and his Vice President, Theodore Roosevelt, defeat Democrat William Jennings Bryan
1903 USA recognizes independence of Panama
1913 Mahatma Gandhi is arrested for leading Indian miners' march in South Africa
1917 New York State adopts a constitutional amendment giving women the right to vote in state elections
1923 USSR adopts experimental calendar, with 5-day "weeks"
1928 59% of Cleveland voters authorize building a stadium with city bonds in the amount of US\$2.5 million
1928 Colonel Jacob Schick patents a "shaving implement" that he later incorporates into the first electric razor
1928 Republican candidate Herbert Hoover is elected President of the United States, defeating Democrat candidate Al Smith
1929 Providence Steam Roller become first NFL team to host a game at night under floodlights; lose 16-0 against the Chicago Cardinals at the Cycledrome, Providence, RI
1934 NFL Philadelphia Eagles beat Cincinnati Reds 64-0
1936 RCA displays TV for press
1938 The three DiMaggio brothers, Joe, Vince, and Dom, play together for the first time in a charity all-star game in California
1940 Franklin D. Roosevelt re-elected US President
1945 The first landing of a jet on a carrier takes place on USS Wake Island when an FR-1 Fireball touches down
1947 NBC's "Meet the Press" debuts, the longest running TV show in the US
1956 Dwight D. Eisenhower is re-elected President of the United

States, defeating Democrat candidate Adlai Stevenson
1961 US government issues a stamp to honor the 100th birthday of James Naismith, the Canadian-born inventor of basketball
1966 1st entire lineup televised in color (NBC)
1973 James Bond film "Man With the Golden Gun" starring Roger Moore begins filming
1984 Incumbent Republican President Ronald Reagan re-elected President of the United States in a landslide; wins 49 states, and defeats Democrat Walter Mondale
1990 Arsenio Hall gets a star on Hollywood's Walk of Fame
1995 Art Modell officially announces Cleveland Browns are moving to Baltimore, Maryland
2001 TV drama series "24" starring Kiefer Sutherland premieres on Fox
2005 "Harry Potter and the Goblet of Fire," the fourth film based on the books by J. K. Rowling, premieres in London and goes on to become the most successful film of the year, earning almost US\$900 million
2012 Barack Obama is re-elected as US President, defeating Republican candidate Mitt Romney
2012 Elizabeth Warren becomes the first female Senator from Massachusetts
2012 Tammy Duckworth becomes the first disabled woman and first person born in Thailand to be elected to US Congress, representing Illinois
2018 Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez (29) of New York is the youngest person ever to be elected to the US House of Representatives
2018 Ilhan Omar (Minnesota) and Rashida Tlaib (Michigan) are the first Muslim women to be elected to the US House of Representatives
2018 Sharice Davids (Kansas) and Deb Haaland (New Mexico) are the first Native American women to be elected to the US House of Representatives
2024 Hurricane Rafael makes landfall in Cuba as a category 3 storm, causing a national power outage
